

#### Parking Safety Information

To assist with creating a safe and better flow of traffic and around St. Andrew's Regional High School, we ask parents, guardians and students to read the following.

Please consider using the parking lot behind the school at the top of the hill for pick up and drop off. There is plenty of parking and students can use the gravel path throughways up the hill to meet parents. This would greatly alleviate traffic jam ups in front of the school and potential accidents on McKenzie Ave.

When dropping off and picking up students please do **not park in the areas in front of the school marked with cones and NO PARKING and NO STOPPING.** Please proceed to the front entrance of the school for Drop off or Pick up.

If cars are parked on the yellow NO PARKING curbs and NO STOPPING areas, it can cause a backup of traffic on to McKenzie Ave and could cause a serious accident.

#### Please do not park in the staff parking lots as those numbers are assigned to staff members.

The lane going up the hill is narrow and has a ditch on either side, **please do not park** on the lane as there are safety issues for users of the high school (some of whom are new drivers), Sacred Heart Church and the Diocesan Centre.

#### **Student Parking**

All student vehicles must be registered with the school. Students who will be driving to school require a parking pass which can be obtained from the office. This pass must be clearly displayed on the dashboard at all times while parked at the school.

Also please assist us with reminding your child that the school is located in residential area and must drive with care.
