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Dear St Andrew's family:

My name is **Michael Lowey** and I'm the proud dad of my girls Alice and Violet (Gr. 12 and 9) I have been selected this year to ride Cops for Cancer Tour the rock, which is a huge honour. Tour de Rock is the biggest fundraiser for Pediatric cancer in BC and I couldn't be more excited. Nineteen of us, which includes police officers, paramedics, firefighters, media riders and a guest rider will be pedaling our bikes from Port Alice all the way down to Victoria (1200 kms), in the hopes to raise one million dollars to support Pediatric cancer research and also to support the families of affected children going through this terrible ordeal. Some of the money will also go to support Camp Goodtimes, which is a summer camp for children affected by cancer, where they can disconnect from the hospital routine and be kids again.

This camp is located in Maple ridge, by Loon lake and it's an absolute gem of a place. I was lucky enough to visit Camp Goodtimes this summer and I was blown away by how amazing, positive and rich effect it had on the kids.

During our tour, we will be stopping at many schools throughout the island and the tradition of these stops is to collect financial donations.

Now, I'm going to ask you for something special, primarily as a father, but also as a man who cares and values life deeply:

I have served as a Paramedic for BC ambulance (BCEHS) for the last 21 years, working on the lower mainland for 5 years and Victoria for the last 16 years and I would like to ask for some help now (Rescue the rescuer!!) **On October 6 at 10:30 am, Tour de rock will be stopping at St Andrew's school.** My *goal is to have St Andrew's raise* \$2000 by October 6 and I'll be shaving my head in solidarity and support for the children affected by cancer. I haven't had a hair cut since training started last March!

I know that's just around the corner, but it is very possible.
