





- In grade 10, students enter the Graduation Program and begin earning credit towards their Dogwood Diploma following the 2018 Graduation Program.
- The 2018 Graduation Program consists of 52 required credits + 28 elective credits for a total of 80 from grades 10 to 12. Religion 10-12 courses are required at St. Andrew's. Every religion class is 4.0 credits.
- In addition, students are required to take 3 BC Provincial Literacy and Numeracy Assessments in grades 10 and 12.



Decision-Making in Grade 10

- Second Language: French or Spanish depending on what grade 9 course, or discontinue with second language program (note some psi require language 11)
- English 10: Choose one of the combined English options (note you cannot change the combinations)
- Math 10: Foundations and Pre-Calculus 10 <u>OR</u>
 Workplace 10

English Language Arts 10

- Under the 2018 Graduation Plan, English Language Arts 10 is divided into 2 options.
- Students must complete four credits under the following two options:
 - 1. Composition 10/New Media 10 (4 credits) OR
 - 2. Literary Studies 10/Spoken Language 10 (4 credits)

- On Paper: Students will receive a paper copy of the course selection form. It must be signed by parents. Digital copies will be found on our website: https://standrewshigh.ca/students/
- On MyEd: Students will also enter their course selection through MyEd (please email Ms. C. Fowlie if a password reset is needed).
- Alternative Selection: Students are asked to provide an alternate choice in their grade 10 course selection. Students should see an academic advisor / counsellor if they have questions about other credit courses they may wish to pursue during grade 10.
