#### Dear St. Andrew's Families,

On October 17<sup>th</sup>, we participated in the **Great BC Shakeout**. This day coincides with "The Great Shakeout" where schools and organizations from across the world run drills to prepare for such emergencies.

Over the PA system, we played sound effects to simulate an earthquake. During that simulation, students were challenged to consider their families preparedness by asking them to reflect on the following questions:

- **Are you prepared?** Meaning, do you have an emergency kit with enough food and water for every member of your home (don't forget those furry, feathered, or scaled members of your home)? You can find a recommendations on how to build on <u>BC's Emergency Management website</u>:
- **Within your home**, have you secured dressers, bookcases, and other tall pieces of furniture so they don't fall during a strong earthquake.
- **Do you have a plan to reunite with family?** This may be especially important if phone lines and cell service are interrupted or overwhelmed.
- Do you have an **evacuation plan** for your home and an agreed upon muster point?

Should an emergency happen during school hours, we are prepared. We have the evacuation plans, and they are rehearsed. We have an agreed upon muster point for our students and staff. We have secured our cabinetry. We have food and water for all students and staff for several days. We are regularly building and adding to the equipment supply list to ensure your children, our students, will be well looked after in an emergency.

As we live in an active earthquake area, I encourage you and your family to prepare for an emergency.


