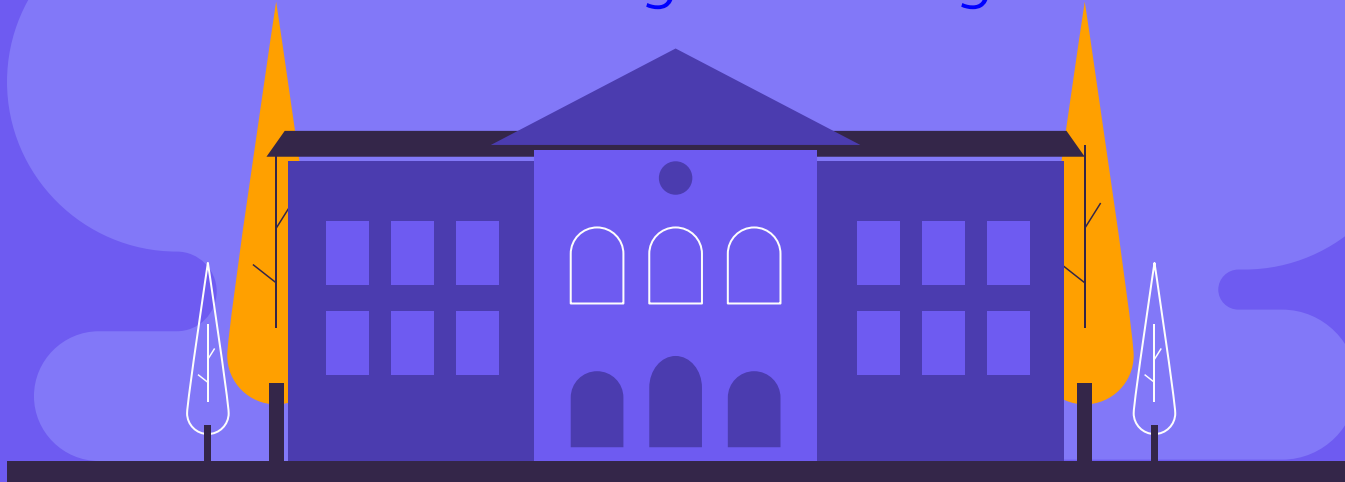




# Course Selection for Students Entering Grade 11

St. Andrew's Regional High School





- **Starting in Grade 10, students enter the Graduation Program and begin earning credit towards their Dogwood Diploma following the 2023 Graduation Program.**
- **The 2023 Graduation Program consists of 52 required credits + 28 elective credits for a total of 80 from grades 10 to 12. Religion 10-12 courses are required at St. Andrew's. Every religion class is 4.0 credits.**
- **In addition, students are required to take 3 BC Provincial Literacy and Numeracy Assessments in Grades 10 and 12.**

## A Note on Career Education

- At St. Andrew's, students complete 2.0 credits of CLC in Grade 11 and 2.0 credits in Grade 12. Students complete CLC outside of the timetable in one Focus Block per week, for a total of 30 instructional hours in Grade 11 and 12.
- Credits for CLC also include 30 hours of work, volunteer, and / or internship experience anytime from the summer entering Grade 10 to the end of Grade 12 as well as 30 hours of Capstone preparation and presentation.



# Indigenous-Focused Course

All students are required to complete 4.0 credits of Indigenous-focused courses in the graduation years. At St. Andrew's, students complete this requirement through the following 4.0 credit course:

## English First Peoples: Literary Studies + Writing 11

English First Peoples (EFP) courses also fulfill the English Language Arts (ELA) graduation requirement as well as university ELA requirements.

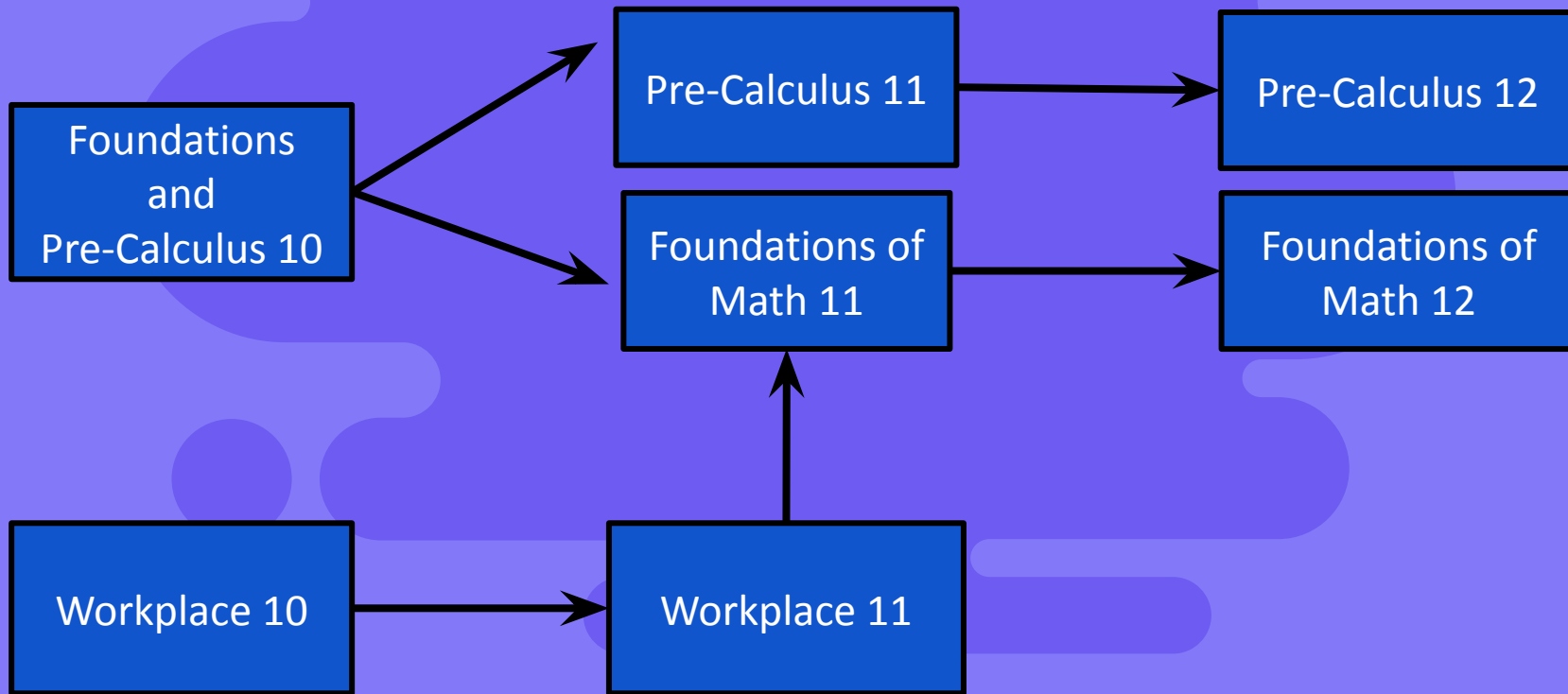


# Decision-Making in Grade 11

- **Social Studies 11 / 12 + Religion 11:** Comparative World Religions 12 (4.0 credits, but two requirements)
- **Elective Courses 11 / 12:** based on post-secondary goals
- **Science(s) 11:** Life Sciences (Biology), Chemistry, Physics, and / or Earth Science
- **Second Language 11:** French, Spanish, or discontinue with second language (changes to psi requirements)
- **Math 11:** Workplace, Foundations, or Pre-Calculus

# Recommended Prerequisites

Course	Recommended Prerequisites
Pre-Calculus 11	73% in Foundations and Pre-Calculus 10
Pre-Calculus 12	73% in Pre-Calculus 11 and at least 67% on the Pre-Calculus 11 final exam
Chemistry 11	73% in Science 10 AND Foundations of Mathematics & Pre-Calculus 10
Physics 11	67% in Science 10 and Foundations and Pre-Calculus 10
Chemistry 12	73% in Chemistry 11 and Pre-Calculus 11 and achieved at least 67% on the Chemistry 11 final exam
Physics 12	73% is recommended in both Physics 11 AND Pre-Calculus 11 At least 67% on the Physics 11 final exam is recommended. Pre-Calculus 12: A minimum of 67% is recommended.

<b>General Requirements</b>	Graduation from high school Minimum of 70% in Grade 11 or Grade 12 English (or their equivalents) At least six academic/non-academic Grade 12 courses (recommended, but not required) Supplemental application for all. Usually early applications due December 1.	
<b>Humanities</b>	For students starting September 2026: There are no Grade 11 requirements	English Studies 12 or English First Peoples 12 If you intend to major in Economics, you must complete Pre-Calculus 12.
<b>Science</b>	For students starting September 2026: Chemistry 11 Physics 11	English Studies 12 or English First Peoples 12 Pre-Calculus 12 Anatomy and Physiology 12, or Chemistry 12, or Physics 12 (Note: Engineering requires Chemistry 12 and Physics 12)
<b>Commerce</b>	For students starting September 2026: There are no Grade 11 requirements	English Studies 12 or English First Peoples 12 Pre-Calculus 12

- **On Paper:** Students will receive a paper copy of the course selection form. It must be signed by parents. Digital copies will be found on our website: <https://standrewshigh.ca/students/>
- **On MyEd:** Students will also enter their course selection through MyEd (please email Ms. C. Fowlie if a password reset is needed).
- **Alternative Selection:** Students are asked to provide an alternate choice in their Grade 11 course selection. Students should see an academic advisor / counsellor if they have questions about other credit courses they may wish to pursue during Grade 11.
