All returning Grade 8-11 students will receive in-person instruction on the course selection process during Focus Block in the Commons with Mr. McLaverty and Ms. Fowlie on the following dates:

- **Grade 11:** Tuesday, February 18
- **Grade 9:** Thursday, February 20 (first)
- **Grade 8:** Thursday, February 20 (second)
- **Grade 10:** Monday, February 24

Grade 10 and 11 students can sign up for Ms. Fowlie's Focus. Grade 8s and 9s should sign up for another Focus since you will only be in the Commons for part of the time. All students should directly go to the Commons except for the Grade 8s who will be called down after the 9s. If we run out of time for the Grade 8s, you will receive your session during Focus on a later date, to be determined.

Students will receive a paper copy of the course selection form during their session, along with step-by-step instructions on how to complete their course selections online through MyEd. The Course Selection Handbook, Course Planning Forms, and course selection instructions for Grades 8-11 will be posted on the school website by early next week. The deadline for submitting both the paper course selection form and completing MyEd course selection is Monday, March 3, 2025.
