Reflection from the Theology Club

This past Sunday, we heard about the woman at the well. Jesus was waiting by Jacob's well in the Samaritan city, Sychar. A Samaritan woman came to draw water, and Jesus asked her to give him a drink. The woman asks Jesus "How is it that you, a Jew, ask a drink of me, a woman of Samaria?" To this Jesus answers that if she asked him, he would give her "living water." Jesus is revealing his intentionality in asking the woman for a drink. While on a physical level his ask for a drink is understandable (it is noon and he is tired), there is also a deeper spiritual level to this question that has to do with his words on the cross: "I thirst." In this instance, Jesus' thirst is for souls and conversion of heart towards his Father. By asking a Samaritan woman, Jesus is showing that he desires the conversion of all people towards himself. Jesus is inviting us into a relationship with him; if we come to him, he will give us water, and we will "never be thirsty" again. This water that Jesus is offering us is his grace. It is especially telling that the Samaritan woman Jesus is talking to is not the most moral person. Jesus knows this, and he shows the woman this by telling her rightly "you have five husbands, and the one you have now is not your husband." This shows that Jesus extends his grace to everyone, including those who live immoral lives, if only we are willing to receive Him. This in turn sets an example for us Christians to follow. We ought not to be moralistic or discriminatory in our interactions with other people, and should instead offer compassion and a path to redemption through God's grace.

Jesus, thank you for giving us the living water of your grace, satisfying our desires, and filling us with your eternal life. Help us to lead others towards you, that we might all worship you in spirit and truth. Amen.
